

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 118–10
OFFERED BY MR. BANKS OF INDIANA

At the end of subtitle B of title XII, insert the following:

1 **SEC. ____ . MODIFICATION AND EXTENSION OF ENHANCE-**
2 **MENT OF UNITED STATES-ISRAEL DEFENSE**
3 **COOPERATION.**

4 (a) MODIFICATION.—Subsection (d) of section 1275
5 of the William M. (Mac) Thornberry National Defense Au-
6 thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021 (22 U.S.C. 2321h
7 note) is amended to read as follows—

8 “(d) DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE ASSESSMENT OF
9 QUANTITY OF PRECISION-GUIDED MUNITIONS AND
10 OTHER MUNITIONS FOR USE BY ISRAEL.—

11 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than April 1,
12 2024, and annually thereafter through 2026, the
13 Secretary of Defense, in concurrence with the Sec-
14 retary of State, shall conduct an assessment with re-
15 spect to the following:

16 “(A) The quantity and type of precision-
17 guided munitions necessary for Israel to protect
18 Israel and prevail in the event of a sustained
19 armed confrontation between Israel and the Is-

1 lamic Republic of Iran and the proxy forces of
2 the Islamic Republic of Iran, including
3 Hezbollah and Hamas.

4 “(B) The quantity and type of other muni-
5 tions necessary for Israel to protect Israel and
6 prevail in the event of a sustained armed con-
7 frontation between Israel and the Islamic Re-
8 public of Iran and the proxy forces of the Is-
9 lamic Republic of Iran, including Hezbollah and
10 Hamas.

11 “(C) The quantity and type of precision-
12 guided munitions necessary for Israel to protect
13 Israel and prevail in the event of a sustained
14 armed confrontation between Israel and
15 Hezbollah.

16 “(D) The quantity and type of precision-
17 guided munitions necessary for Israel to protect
18 Israel and prevail in the event of a sustained
19 armed confrontation between Israel and any
20 other armed group or terrorist organization,
21 such as Hamas.

22 “(E) The resources the Government of
23 Israel would need to dedicate to acquire the
24 quantity and type of munitions described in
25 subparagraphs (A) through (D).

1 “(F) Whether, as of the date on which the
2 applicable assessment is completed, sufficient
3 quantities and types of munitions to conduct
4 operations described in subparagraphs (A)
5 through (D) are present in—

6 “(i) the inventory of the military
7 forces of Israel;

8 “(ii) the War Reserves Stock Allies-
9 Israel;

10 “(iii) any other United States stock-
11 pile or depot within the area of responsi-
12 bility of United States Central Command,
13 as the Secretary of Defense considers ap-
14 propriate to disclose to the Government of
15 Israel; or

16 “(iv) the inventory of the United
17 States Armed Forces, as the Secretary of
18 Defense considers appropriate to disclose
19 to the Government of Israel.

20 “(G) United States planning—

21 “(i) to assist Israel to prepare for the
22 contingencies described in subparagraphs
23 (A) through (D); and

24 “(ii) to resupply Israel with the quan-
25 tity and type of munitions described in

1 subparagraphs (A) through (D) in the
2 event of such a contingency.

3 “(H) The quantity and pace at which the
4 United States is capable of pre-positioning, rap-
5 idly replenishing, or assisting in the rapid re-
6 plenishment of, stockpiles of such munitions in
7 the inventory of the military forces of Israel
8 and the War Reserves Stock Allies-Israel in
9 preparation for, and to conduct, the operations
10 described in subparagraphs (A) through (D).

11 “(2) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out the as-
12 sessment required by paragraph (1), the Secretary
13 of Defense shall seek to consult with appropriate
14 counterparts of the Government of Israel.

15 “(3) INVENTORY.—Not later than 90 days after
16 the date on which the first assessment required by
17 paragraph (1) is conducted, and every 90 days
18 thereafter until December 31, 2028, the Secretary of
19 Defense shall submit to the appropriate congres-
20 sional committees, the Committee on Appropriations
21 of the House of Representatives, and the Committee
22 on Appropriations of the Senate a report on the ac-
23 tions being taken and the progress made by the
24 United States since the submission of the prior re-
25 port under this paragraph to ensure that the mili-

1 tary forces of Israel and the War Reserves Stock Al-
2 lies-Israel have the inventory and pre-positioned
3 stocks necessary to prepare for, and to conduct, the
4 operations described in subparagraphs (A) through
5 (D) of paragraph (1), including procedures imple-
6 mented by the United States for rapidly replen-
7 ishing, or assisting in the rapid replenishment of,
8 stockpiles of such munitions for use by Israel as may
9 be necessary.”.

10 (b) MUNITIONS TRANSFER AUTHORITY EXTEN-
11 SION.—Section 1275(e) of the William M. (Mac) Thorn-
12 berry National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year
13 2021 (22 U.S.C. 2321h note) is amended by striking “the
14 date that is three years after the date of the enactment
15 of this Act” and inserting “January 1, 2025”.
